CC35 Meeting Summary

Confirmation on Rules of Engagement (including Chatham House rules and anti-trust guidelines).

1. Minutes CC34

- Decision: CC34 reviewed and approved.

2. Signatory vote results

- Successful and positive Signatory voting process held, with 56% of eligible Signatories participating, significantly more than the threshold of 40%. An overwhelming majority approved both motions.
- Breakdown of the results:

- The Secretariat will follow up on specific feedback (e.g. data quality & integrity, alignment/convergence industry standards) with Signatories and see if/how refinement of strategic plan is required.
 - Signatory engagement (see also agenda item 5):
 - Near year-end, Council members should seek to further increase signatory commitment in reaching out to and engaging their caucuses.
- ### 4. Operational Updates
- CAF v1.6 has been locked as of end of August. Launch has been set for early 2024.
 - Adoption is progressing but following different pattern than last year.

- SLCP acceptance is slowly but steadily growing.
- There is an increase in the number of active data quality & integrity investigations. SLCP held a successful policy roundtable in Boston. A very positive out-take of this is SLCP getting recognition for our work in Human Rights and Due Diligence as well as other upcoming policies.
- SLCP Roadshow on expansion (adjacent sectors and upstream supply chain) has been planned in Asia. SLCP team is growing.

5. *SLCP independence*

- JWG: 3 key agreements for the separation finalized (approved by SAC Board & ready for signing by both SAC & SLCP Executive Directors):
 - IP & Asset Transfer
 - Partnership Agreement
 - Transition Services H1 2024
- The JWG has now transitioned into a more operational mode.
- Stichting SLCP has been established. Management Board members have been temporarily appointed, and Janet as Executive Director has been granted temporary power of attorney.
- Application for PBO status has been filed.
- SLCP has engaged KRC, a financial and HR service provider.
- Application to open Stichting SLCP bank account has been made.
- Next step is to move towards transitioning current Council members to new Board (Management/Supervisory).
 - Fiduciary rights & responsibilities memo shared with Council. Seems clear.
 - Draft Bylaws in progress (Governance Committee)
 - A survey will be sent to all SLCP Council members by 13 October with a deadline of 23 October, enabling current Council members to advise their willingness to serve on Stichting Board and which tier (Management/Supervisory).
 - Based on the outcome of this survey, the Governance Committee will propose the new Board line-up for 2024 (with a minimum requirement of 3 Board members on each tier).
- At the next Council meeting (CC36), this proposal will be shared and agreed, potentially also allowing time for deep dive into the fiduciary responsibilities of future Board members.
